József Antall was a participant in the 1956 revolution as a young man and an historian who became the first Prime Minister of Hungary after the regime change in 1990. Five months later, taxi drivers protested against a drastic increase in gasoline prices with a blockade in Budapest and around the country. Antall and his government were able to resolve the crisis and preserve the young democracy. Both the blockade and its resolution remain controversial to this day.


